A Message from Pastor Toby

What do you think of the Resurrection?

As winter gives way to spring, and Christmas becomes a fading memory, I've been reflecting on a recent trip to a local theater to watch the Dicken's classic, A Christmas Carol. I thoroughly enjoyed the performance and even teared up a little when I heard old Scrooge vow, "I will honor Christmas in my heart, and try to keep it all the year." Indeed, a truly admirable and worthy goal.

That got me thinking, when we look in the New Testament, the observance of Christ's birth (Galatians 4:4) is not spoken of nearly as often as the Resurrection of Christ (Acts 4:2). If you want a Bible study, use your computer and compare the number of verses between the birth and the resurrection. The spotlight is definitely on the death and resurrection of Jesus.

Typically during December, we greet one another with a, "Merry Christmas," which I love to do, but during April, as we approach the observance of the resurrection, what common greeting will we use? Frankly, outside of chocolate bunnies, colored eggs, or Easter lilies how many Americans will have any expression at all of this life changing historical miracle?

Don't misunderstand me, I love to celebrate Christmas and there are ample opportunities to share the hope of Jesus within that season, but the overwhelming message of the Apostles in the Bible was that "Jesus, which was dead,... [is] alive." (Acts 25:19) Furthermore, the resurrection of Christ lays the foundation for the resurrection of the followers of Christ, to live forevermore.

So what holiday greeting will we use for such a monumental event, "Merry Resurrection?" Well, I'm drawing a blank, but perhaps the better approach would be to ask our friends, neighbors, family, or the cashier at the checkout counter, "So, what do you think of the resurrection?" Then, give them time to freely answer, and see what conversation may grow from that holiday greeting. (1 Peter 3:15)

What does it mean to be a Deacon? (1 Tim 3:8-14)

"An Interview with Scott Lincke"

Nancy: Scott, how many years have you been serving as deacon of the church? Scott: I think 8-10 years. It has been so long ago, it is hard to remember.

Nancy: It sounds like you have made a career, as a deacon, lol. But, I would like to hear what sparked

your interest in this.

Scott: Smiling, he said "It was my parents who first set the foundation, by teaching me to help others. I believe I learned to have a heart to want to serve at a young age, because I saw it in my parents.

Nancy: When were you Saved?

Scott: 1999

Nancy: Do you have a momentum you could share with the readers?

Scott: Well, I remember Pastor Toby would ask me to go with him to visit some sick folks in the hospital. It was one of those visits, he began to talk to me about the idea of being a deacon. He ask me to read *1 Timothy 3:8* and pray about it. This was a turning point in my life, because I already had a heart to helping others, and knew this had to be God's calling on my life.

1 Timothy 3:8 Likewise must the deacons be grave, not doubletongued, not given to much wine, not greedy of filthy lucre;

Nancy: What are the responsibilities of a Deacon?

Scott: It is to assist the Pastor; in other words to take some of the load off of him. Some of those things include: (1) Visitation; (2) Church Attendance; (3) Security to the building; (3) helping others; specifically older folks who are unable to drive or do things around their home; (4) and anything that may arise unexpectantly.

Nancy: Is there anything you would like to add, regarding your experience as a deacon?

Scott: Sometimes it can be discouraging, but I try to keep in mind I am doing this for the Lord. I truly appreciate my church family. When I see a smile, handshake, hug, or a little food (IoI), this is encouragement to me in helping others. Also, I want to thank my Pastors for being good role models.
