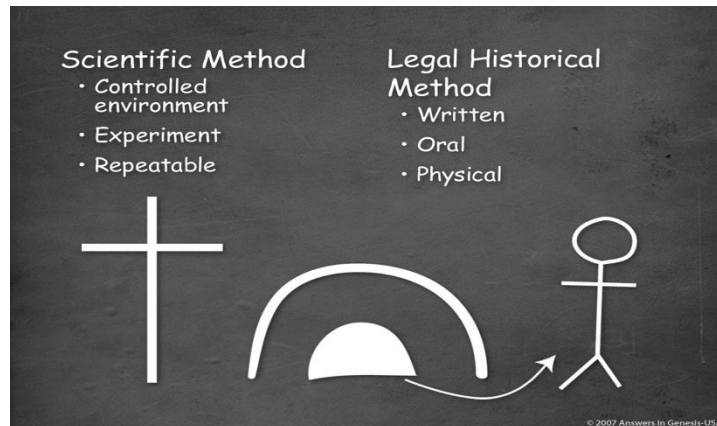


## 2. Common Misconceptions

Misconception 1:

“Christianity must be proven scientifically; I’ll accept Christianity when you prove it with the scientifically method.”



Misconception 2:

“I can’t accept Christianity, because there isn’t enough evidence for me to be 100% sure that it is true.”

- You can’t prove anything historical with 100% certainty.
- “There is enough evidence to convince anyone who is not set against it, but not enough to bring anyone into the kingdom who will not come” (Blaise Pascal).
- The historical evidence for Christianity is not absolute, but it is sufficient.

Misconception 3:

“Truth is relative. If you believe something, that is truth for you.”

- Believing something does not make it true.
  
- The idea that truth is relative is self-contradictory.

Misconception 4: “It doesn’t matter what you believe as long as you are sincere in your faith. It really doesn’t matter who or what you put your faith in. The important thing is that you believe—period.”
