
2. Common Misconceptions

Misconception 1:


"Christianity must be proven <u>scientifically</u>; I'll accept Christianity when you prove it with the scientifically method."



Misconception 2:

"I can't accept Christianity, because there isn't enough evidence for me to be 100% sure that it is true."

- You <u>can't</u> prove anything historical with 100% certainty.
- ➤ "There is <u>enough</u> evidence to convince anyone who is not set against it, but not enough to bring anyone into the kingdom who <u>will not come</u>" (Blaise Pascal).
- ➤ The historical evidence for Christianity is not <u>absolute</u>, but it is <u>sufficient</u>.



➤ The idea that truth is <u>relative</u> is self-contradictory.

Misconception 4: "It doesn't matter what you believe as long as you are <u>sincere</u> in your faith. It really doesn't matter who or what you put your faith in. The important thing is that you believe—period."
