"From the Heart of Senior Pastor, Toby Cambron"

Governor DeWine mentioned that today, March 4, marks the one anniversary of Ohio's fight against Covid-19. I am saddened when I reflect upon the people who have lost the battle against the virus. It is equally concerning to reflect upon the damage our economy, our communities, churches, schools, and our families. Earlier this week, at my routine visit to the dentist, I noticed my hygienist was unusually quiet as she attended to my teeth. When I asked if there was something bothering her, without hesitation she began to share her sorrows and frustrations this long year of isolation has brought. Though she has not missed a day of work, she has missed an entire year of her family, friends, and freedom to move about her community.

Our lives have been altered by a microscopic organism that originated in some far-off part of the world we had never previously heard of. If you have lost someone or some essential value this previous year, then your sorrow is expected for hardship has changed life. If the year has left with no hope beyond this life, then you may become swallowed up in misery (1 Cor 15:19). However, as the people, who maintain faith in God, and a relationship with the Lord Jesus, we are never without hope (1 Thess 4:13). If we are part of God's redeemed, we have been promised an eternal hope (Rev 5:9), so that death, nor life, angels, nor powers, anything present, nor anything yet to come can separate us from the love of God we have found in our Lord Jesus (Rom 8:38-39).

Perhaps you are struggling with the same sorrows the hygienist was expressing? There is hope in God, and the representation of God, in the Lord Jesus. Granted, there are times when our God may seem silent, impersonal, and far away. The Lord Jesus knew how we may struggle when alone in this journey, so he created his representation here on earth. That representation is his church, for we are his hands, his feet, his warm embrace, for we are the body of Christ (1 Cor 12:12-27). How long has it been since you have experienced the body of Christ? Is there a fear of death, of life, or anything present nor yet to come is keeping you away? The Lord is the head of his church and this body still needs you, for every part is essential. Now the snow melts, the surge retreats, and the remembrance of the Resurrection draws near. There is hope beyond the present hardship and there is the body of Christ, resurrected, revived, reaching out in a warm embrace (Luke 24).

Dying In Our Place

"Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed." 1 Peter 2:24

Let us realize this Spring Season that the ultimate reason that Jesus became a man was to do exactly two things; bear our sins and die on the cross for you. Yes, of course, much else was done by Jesus, and many other reasons round out the fulness of why he came to earth. But at the heart of his coming, at the core of his choosing to follow the will and plan of his father and take on our human nature, was this purpose: to bear our sin and die. As Jesus articulates his own mission, "For even the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give his life a ransom for many." (Mark 10:45)

What an amazing truth- the eternal Son of the Father left the glories of heaven and took on our human nature for one ultimate purpose: to bear the sin we have committed and die the death that we deserve, because he knew that only in this way would we be saved.

Secondly, let us realize this, that Christ and Christ alone, is the only substitute who can adequately represent us in his offering on our behalf. Furthermore, realize that Christ alone made the payment that fully and eternally satisfied God's wrath against our sin. Christ is the one who fulfilled what we need the most through his substitutionary sacrifice upon the cross our everlasting adoration, praise, worship, and allegiance. With Paul we can affirm that we have indeed been bought with an unspeakably great price, and therefore it is only right that we should glorify God in our bodies (1 Cor. 6:20).

What is the meaning of Tefilah?

The Hebrew translation for prayer is *Tefilah*. The English meaning for prayer is a devout petition to God or an act of worship. *Tefilah* is so much more—-it is defined as *a labor of the heart*. The key principle to your relationship with your Creator is to serve Him with all your heart. It is an awakening of the hidden love within the heart that drives us to a state of intimate union with our Creator. It is a time to self evaluate and self judge. *Tefilah* is also attachment, when we create a bond between ourself and God.

Deuteronomy 11:13 And it will be, if you hearken to My commandments that I command you this day to love the Lord, your God, and to serve Him with all your heart and with all your soul,

Often, we only pray when we need something from God. The bible tells us to make our requests known before God (Phil 4:6). It does <u>not</u> say in case of an emergency-PRAY!

When I take a closer look at *Tefilah*, I realize my prayer-life is like a ladder. I cannot get to the top step in one jump, I must take it step by step. The first step is to believe in God's son, Jesus Christ, who shed his blood for me, a sinner, upon a cross (Rom 5:8). Next, accept the gift of salvation He offers to all who come to Him. Now that I am a child of God, my next step is to grow in my faith as I continue to climb the ladder.

Finally, as I meditate upon *Tefilah*, I learn that it is *a labor of the heart* and if I want to reach the top of the ladder, I need to work on my relationship with JESUS daily.
