A Message From Pastor Toby

In the world of sports, we generally do not admire the quitter who runs from the contest when the competition is strenuous. Though only to the winner goes the winner's metal, it is not always the winner who earns the greater respect. Most parents encourage their kids to enter sports to learn values beyond the thrill of winning. I recall when one of our daughters chose to play soccer in a co-ed middle school league where there would be teenage boys larger and stronger than I was. I recall one occasion where she attempted to play defense against a much larger boy who knocked her right off her feet and straight onto her back. We felt immediate alarm as she rolled over on the dusty hard ground, but then impressed when she climbed to her feet and began to chase her opponent with vengeance in her eyes.

Sometimes it is the underdog we admire, whom everyone doubted could compete, yet kept going persevering through the pain, disappointment, and doubts. It is those moments of great adversity that reveal the values beyond who will claim first place. Oh, do not misunderstand, every contestant should play to win, but there is more to value than winning, and one of those values is not being the quitter. It is each moment of adversity where we forge greater strength to continue beyond the next hardship life's journey requires.

"If thou faint in the day of adversity, thy strength is small." Proverbs 24:10

From the pulpit of the church this August we have been considering the life, trials, and faith of the Old Testament prophet Job. Though we can spend significant time speaking on the severity of Job's suffering, the reasons it was permitted, or the mysterious exchange between the LORD and Satan, the apostle James was impressed with Job's ability to endure the hardship. James 5:10-11 mentions the example found in the prophets who overcame their adversities. "Ye have heard of the patience of Job," and, "we count them happy which endure." In the passage happy, or makarizō in the Greek, means to esteem, or to beatify, even as it is used in Luke 1:48 where the virgin Mary realized, "from hence forth all generations shall call me blessed." That is, those who look back to this moment of my life will commemorate me on this incredible occasion. For Mary, it was having the honor of being the mother of the Christ child. For Job, it was the steady perseverance that did not allow him to quit even though he was the underdog against the provocations of Satan.

LifeWise Whitehall Looking for Volunteers


